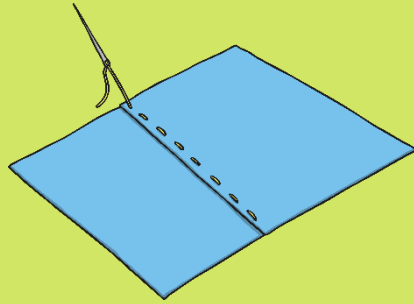


Different Stitches



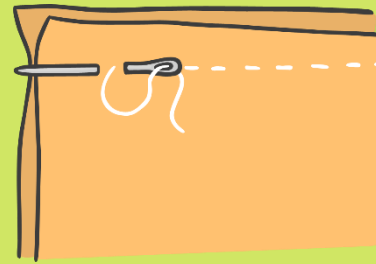
Running Stitch

A quick, easy stitch used to join fabric together. Also used for decoration.



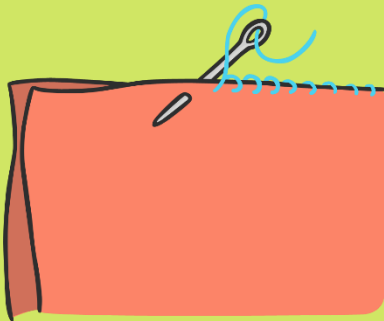
Backstitch

A strong stitch, useful for holding seams together.



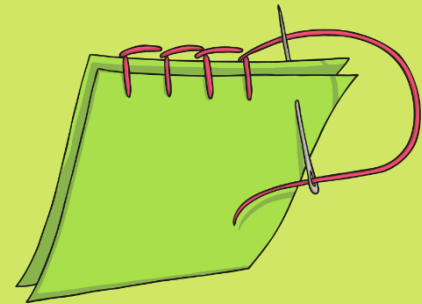
Whipstitch

A simpler version of blanket stitch.

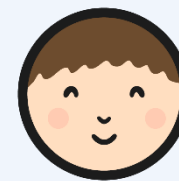


Blanket Stitch

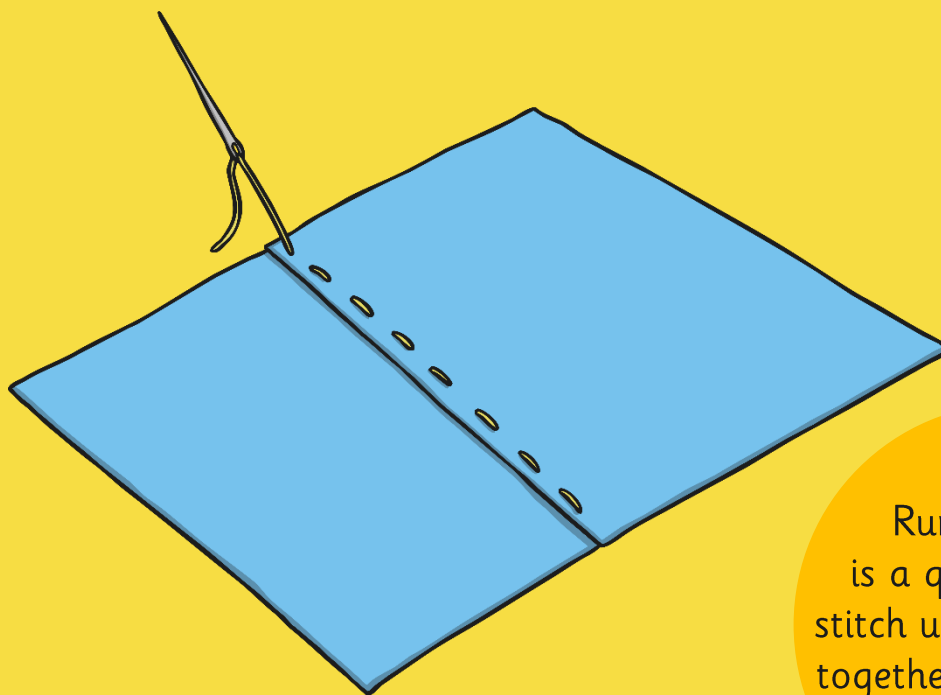
A decorative stitch for strengthening edges.



Running Stitch



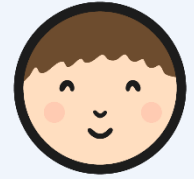
On your scrap piece of fabric try sewing a running stitch.



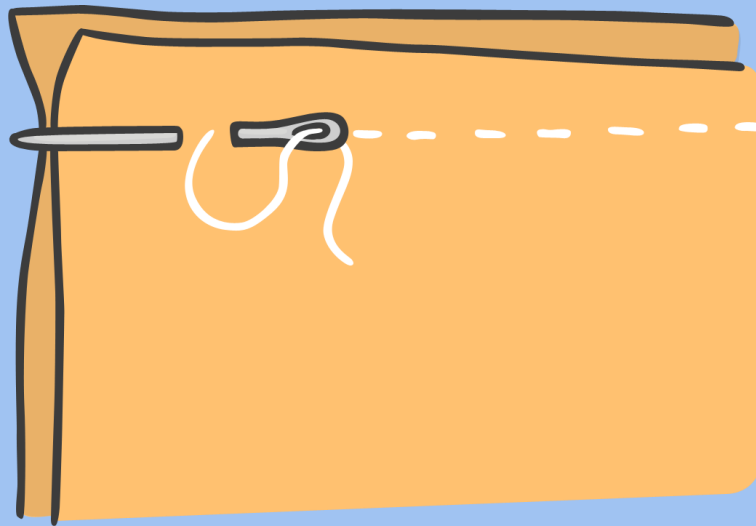
Running stitch is a quick and easy stitch used to join fabric together. It is also used for decoration.

Backstitch



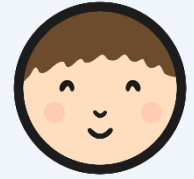
On your scrap piece of fabric try sewing a backstitch.



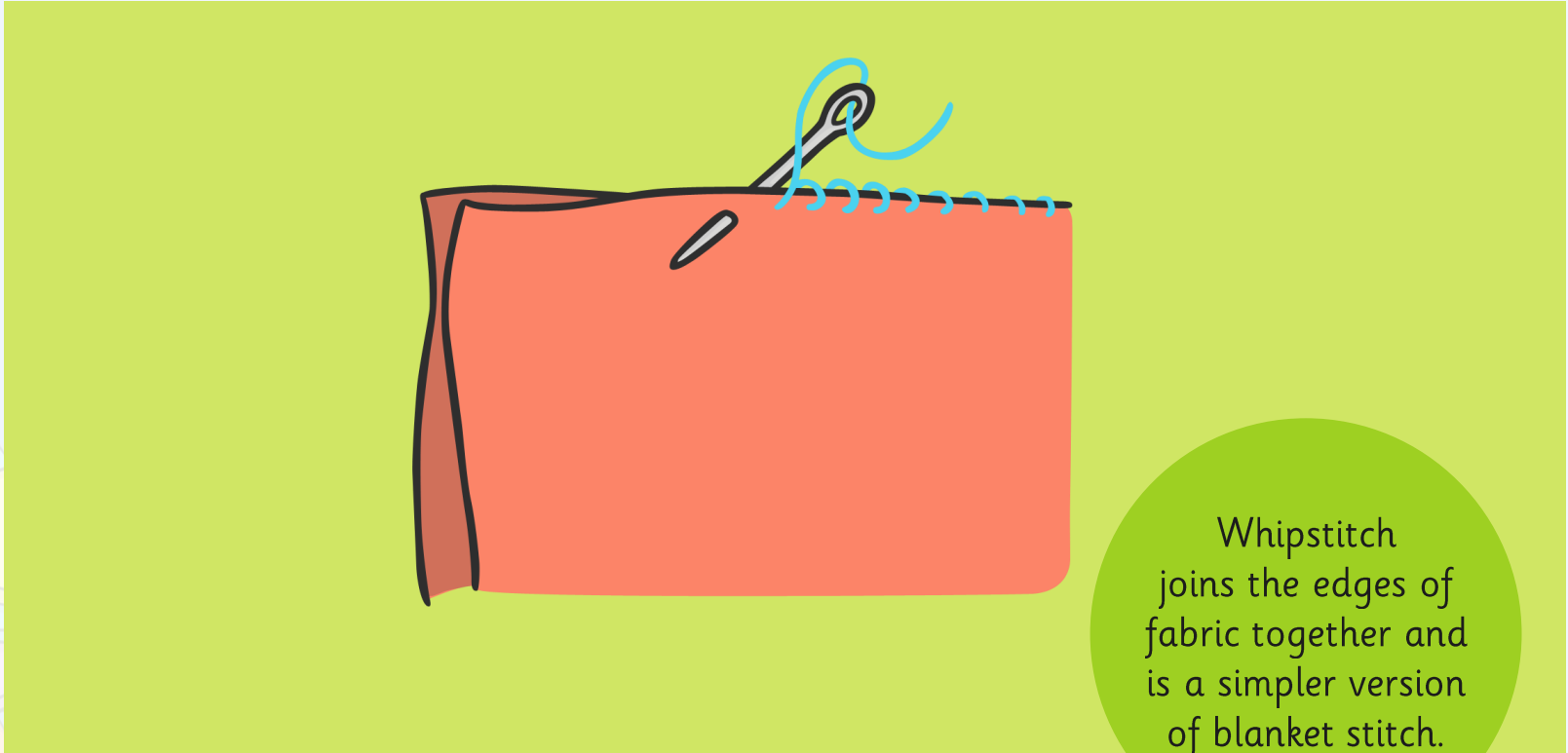
Backstitch

Whipstitch



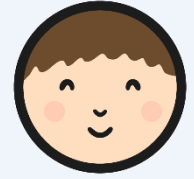
On your scrap piece of fabric try sewing an whipstitch.



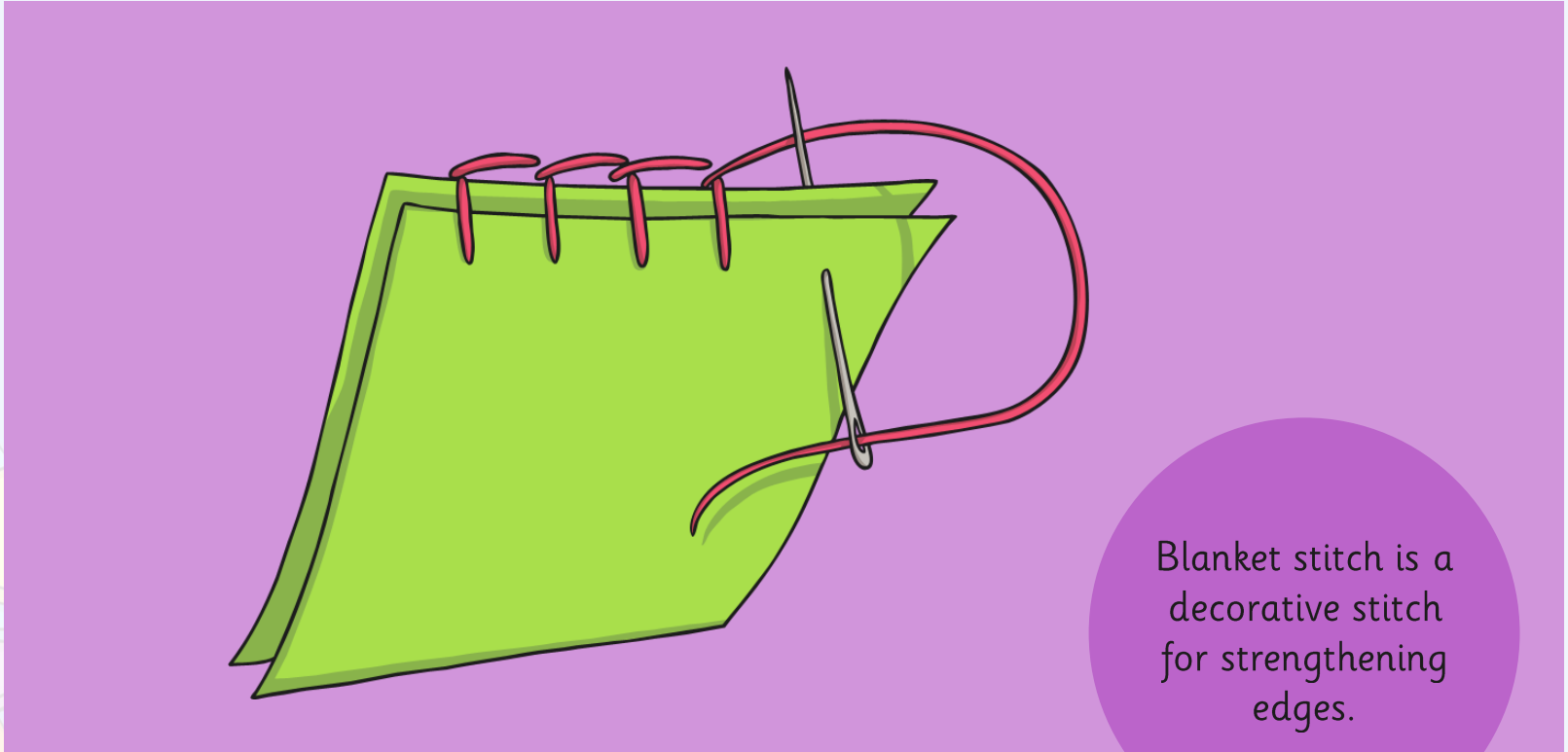
Whipstitch
