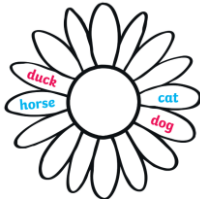


Ideas for learning spellings

Here are some ideas that you might find useful to help you learn your spellings. On some weeks your homework may be to use some of these strategies

Write it three times Write the words three times. You could use a different coloured pencil for each time you write it. spelling spelling spelling	Word pyramid Write the spellings out and make a pyramid. Add one more letter each time until you have the full word. w wo wor word words	Backwards Words Write each of your words out forwards. Then, write them all backwards stopped deppots
Across and down Write your words across and down the page, sharing the same starting letter. when h e n	Use them in a story Can you write a short story using the spelling words? Underline the spellings to show when you have used them. 	Spelling flowers Draw a flower and write a different word in each of the petals. 
Rainbow words Use a different colour for each letter of the word or for each syllable. spelling spelling	Coloured vowels or consonants Write out each of your words. Then, either go over the vowels or consonants in each word using a coloured pencil. spelling spelling	Colour the tricky bit Write out the words but use a colour for the bit of the spelling you are finding difficult to get right. exercise height particular
Join the dots Write each of your words using dots. Then, join the dots with a coloured pencil to make your word. 	Fancy fonts Write you spellings out in an interesting style.
